**Skedaddle Ridge Trails People Inc. -- Club #51
Minutes: June 2021**

The June 24th meeting was held at the Mount Pleasant Community Center with 12 members present. A moment of silence was held in memory of Wendell Mackenzie.

Minutes: The minutes of the October 2020 meeting were read. Moved by Stirling, seconded by Kelly, “The minutes are approved as presented”. Carried.

Treasurer’s Report: Allison presented the financial report. Moved by Allison, seconded by Kelly, “The Treasurer’s report is approved as presented.” Carried.

Old Business

1. **Trail Permits:** The cost of the 2022 Trail Permits has not been determined. Quad NB will be providing information at the AGM, if held, or will be decided by the Board who forwards recommendation to the Provincial government. A portion of the permit fee is returned to the Club to support trail maintenance.
2. **Signs:** The Provincial Trail #10 signs have been changed to #25. The Club has purchased new #25 ‘stickers’ to place on the existing signs.
3. **Annual General Meeting:** The date has not been determined. A possibility the AGM might be held in fall 2021.

New Business:

1. **Skedaddle Trailer:** Trailer is out of storage. Some maintenance work was completed.
2. **Trail Maintenance:** A discussion was held on a number of trail concerns such as brush clearing, culvert replacement, rest area work, signage replacement, etc. Local contractors will be contacted for estimates to perform this work. Some maintenance will require a watercourse certified contractor. It was decided Sat. July 10th would be a workday to complete these tasks.
3. **Trail Mapping:** Government personnel are currently in the process of mapping all Skedaddle trails. Once completed, new signs will be purchased for all newly numbered trails. The Quad NB website has the trail numbers identified. Upon completion, a new Skedaddle map will be made available both electronically and hard copy. The new map will identify new trail numbers, removal of some existing trails and addition of new trails.
3. **Club Bank Account Signing Officers:** Following member discussion, Bob moved, “A minimum of two signatures will be required on Club cheques. The members approved are Allison Kent, Stirling Kent, Kelly Lyon, Curtis Crain, Villa Mackenzie, Lloyd Culberson.” Seconded by Norman. Motion carried. Allison will contact the bank and complete the required bank documentation.
4. **Regional Director Report:** Bob provided the members an update on a number of topics. There is a proposed trail mapped to connect Skedaddle Club with the Nashwaak Valley Club. The Victoria Club has received approval for a trail on Acadia Timber property in the Plaster Rock area and the Mad-Vic Club has proposed a link to this trail from the Grand Falls area. Meetings have been held with Acadia Timber and more information to follow. The safe Quad sport is growing very rapidly and many families are purchasing quads for outdoor recreation. An update was provided on the Town of Woodstock community meeting for quad access on municipal and highway streets within the Town and a proposed trail link. An update was given on the missing Grafton-Woodstock missing CPR bridge span initiative. Quad NB is in the process of releasing a media release regarding Quad use within the Province and public concerns being expressed. Clubs will be requested to post this on their websites.
